Stakeholder engagement on proposed changes to checks and fees relating to the import of plants, plant products and other objects.

I am writing to notify you on behalf of the Secretary of State and Scottish and Welsh Ministers, of the upcoming changes to The Plant Health etc. (Fees) (England) Regulations 2018, The Plant Health etc. (Fees) (Wales) Regulations 2018, The Plant (Import Inspection Fees) (Scotland) Regulations 2014 and The Plant Health and The Official Controls (Plant Health) (Frequency of Checks) Regulations 2022, which are intended to take effect when the new Sanitary and Phytosanitary (SPS) agreement with the EU is implemented.

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Annex A - Stakeholder engagement on changes to checks and fees relating to the import of plants, plant products and other objects

Section 1 – Introduction

- 1.1. This stakeholder engagement seeks to inform you of amendments to the relevant plant health fees, import inspection, and official controls regulations as outlined in the covering letter. Amendments are being made to Plant Health etc (Fees) (England) Regulations 2018 and the Plant Health etc. (Fees) (Wales) Regulations 2018 (“the English and Welsh fees regulations”), the Plant (Import Inspection Fees) (Scotland) Regulations 2014, and The Official Controls (Plant Health) (Frequency of Checks) Regulations 2022.
- 1.2. As part of the planned UK-EU SPS agreement, Great Britain will align with EU import inspection (documentary, identity and physical) frequencies. The changes proposed here will ensure that fees are aligned to the updated frequency of import checks (documentary, identity and physical) for goods imported into England, Scotland and Wales from Rest of World (i.e. non-EU third countries).
 - Remove fees for import checks on goods from the EU.
 - Amendments to the documentary check fee for imports from Rest of World.
 - Amendments to the physical and identity checks fees for imports from Rest of World.
- 1.3. These amendments are required to ensure that England, Scotland and Wales charge correctly for plant health services, once the SPS agreement with the EU is implemented.

Section 2 – Proposed changes

2.1 Remove fees for checks on imports from the EU

We will remove fees for documentary, identity and physical checks on goods imported directly into England, Scotland and Wales from EU member states as these checks would not take place under the SPS agreement.

2.2. Amendments to documentary check fees

We are amending the English, Scottish and Welsh fees regulations to reflect that there will only be one fee for a documentary check, which will either be £5.25 or £6.00. This will be the fee payable by the importer of a Rest of World consignment in respect of a documentary check of each phytosanitary certificate or phytosanitary certificate for re-export accompanying the consignment.

2.3 Amendments to physical and identity inspection fees

England and Wales

A summary table of the indicative physical and identity inspection fees for England and Wales is provided below. The documentary check fee will be £5.25 in all cases. Any reference to ‘third country’ in the table does not include EU member states:
