Response to stakeholder engagement on the introduction of import checks and fees on medium risk goods from the EU, Liechtenstein and Switzerland

Thank you for submitting views on the above stakeholder engagement. This letter is to notify you of the outcome.

Background

On 29 August 2023, the UK Government published the final Border <u>Target Operating Model</u> (BTOM) that introduces a new approach to phytosanitary (SPS) controls applying to imports of plants and plants products at the border. Defra and the Scottish and Welsh Governments will implement the new SPS regime in accordance with the timetable detailed in the TOM, with the second stage, coming into force by 30 April 2024.

Proposal

To introduce documentary and risk-based identity and physical checks on medium-risk plants and plant products from the EU, Liechtenstein, and Switzerland. We also intend to update fees relating to imports of certain goods from Rest of World (RoW) countries in response to a change in inspection frequencies for such goods.

Summary of responses

Three responses were received; two from Scottish businesses who raised no concerns with the proposals and one from the NFU which highlighted concerns related to the flat rate fee for plants for planting and the definition of final user. NFU commented that the flat rate fee should be extended to include bulbs for planting. The NFU also suggested that the





definition of 'final user' should be expanded to include businesses which import plants that then never leave their commercial facilities (e.g. importing young plants for the greenhouse production of edible fruit).

Response:

The NFU's responses are outside the scope of this current consultation which focussed on medium risk goods from the EU (bulbs are a high risk good). Flat rate fees for England and Wales were consulted on in 2022 (please see the response here). During this consultation, only one business responded specifically on bulbs, and they were not supportive of the flat rate fee being applied to bulbs. We are grateful for the comments received from the NFU in this current consultation period and will consider further with respect to the flat rate fee.

Since 1 January 2021, GB has operated its own sanitary and phytosanitary (SPS) regime, which is focused on addressing the risks it faces. This regime includes risk-based import checks of plants, plant products and other objects to avoid the introduction of harmful plant pests and diseases. These risk-based checks are in line with WTO/SPS principles and consistent with our obligations under the EU Withdrawal Act.

'Final user' is defined within the Plant Health Regulation (2016/2031) as "any person acting for purposes which are outside that person's trade, business or profession who acquires plants or plant products for personal use". This definition allows private individuals, taking part in very low risk movements of plants and plant products, to be subject to lower levels of plant health controls appropriate to the risk posed.

Commercial movements and uses of plants represent a higher risk due to the quantities and practices involved, as such higher frequencies of import checks apply. For example, greenhouse production of tomatoes poses a known risk of spreading several GB quarantine pests should these be present on imported plants. Where risk assessments allow, a lower frequency of import check is applied. This is the case when bulbs are imported for commercial cut flower production, where a 10% import check (and fee) is applied.

To support businesses in adopting the new EU-GB requirements, the UK Government took the decision to introduce new measures in phases for the import of EU plants and plant material. This has allowed us to protect GB biosecurity whilst maintaining the efficient trade in goods such as plants and plant products.

The scope of the BTOM is beyond the EU. It creates a new global regime, aimed at making the border easier to use and, where possible, reducing processes and administrative burdens on businesses. The BTOM will deliver a suite of new digital improvements and digital systems to improve efficiencies across border processes, and data will be used to inform the risk profile of commodities being moved across the border.

Next steps

The responses received were generally supportive of the proposal. Defra and the Scottish and Welsh Governments intend to implement this proposal from 30 April 2024.

Medium risk EU goods will be subject to checks from 30th April 2024. For details of medium risk EU goods please see the <u>Plant Health Portal</u>. Fruit and vegetables from the EU are currently excluded from import checks. For England and Scotland, the expected

fees for physical and identity checks are detailed in Annex 1, and fees for reduced documentary checks for medium risk goods from the EU, Liechtenstein and Switzerland are detailed in Annex 2.

I would like to thank those responding for taking the time to submit views on the stakeholder engagement. Your comments have been very valuable in working to develop a policy position.
