Pest Alert: *Epitrix* potato beetles

- Epitrix is a very damaging beetle pest of potato from North America that is now established in Spain and Portugal.
- The main **risk of entry** into the UK is via **infested potatoes imported** from Spain and Portugal.
- The first record of *Epitrix* in the UK was in Spring 2015 when symptomatic tubers and dead larvae were intercepted on a consignment of Spanish ware potatoes potatoes imported from an area thought to be free of the pest. **It is not currently present in the UK**.
