Acronym	Meaning
AD	Additional Declaration - Actions that need to be taken prior to import/export for pests and diseases of particular concern to the European Union, the details of which may appear on the Phytosanitary Certificate accompanying the consignment. May also be known as special requirement.
ALB	Asian Longhorn Beetle (<i>Anoplophora glabripennis)</i> –invasive pest listed in the Plant Health Directive
ALVS	Automatic License Verification System - Links PEACH and CHIEF together
AWB	Air Way Bill – Waybill for goods transported by air
ВСР	Border Control Post
ВСМР	Biosecurity Control Management Plant (required for PHEATS)
BR	Brown Rot – of potato is caused by the bacterium <i>Ralstonia solanacearum</i> and is listed in the EC Plant Health Directive and is notifiable in the UK
CA	Competent Authority – The central authority responsible for the organisation of official controls and of other official activities.
СВ	Colorado Beetle (Leptinotarsa decemlineata) – Notifiable quarantine pest whose introduction is prohibited under the EC Single Market Protected Zone arrangements
CEO	Chief Executive Officer – The most senior corporate officer of the Agency responsible for overall operations and performance
CHIEF	Customs Handling of Import/Export Freight system - Customs clearance system
CLB	Citrus Longhorn Beetle <i>(Anoplophora chinensis)</i> – Non-native pest; a quarantine pest for the EU

CMR	Convention relative au contrat de transport international de marchandises par route. It's a waybill for goods transported by road
CRN	Client Reference Number - unique number for each client generated by eDomero
DED	Dutch Elm Disease – a fungus (<i>Ophiostoma novo-ulmi</i>) which has affected most mature elms across Britain
DUCR	Declaration Unique Consignment Reference - used by the customs system as the main consignment identity code
DUS	Distinctness, uniformity and stability – requirements as set out in Commission Directive for certain agricultural and vegetable species.
EPPO	European and Mediterranean Plant Protection Organization – Responsible for cooperation across member countries to prevent the introduction and spread of plant pests
ETSF	External Temporary Storage Facility - bonded warehouse without airside access
EU	European Union
FC	Forestry Commission – A devolved body to protect and expand forests and woodland
FERA	Formerly the Food and Environment Research Agency, now FSL (see below)
FSL	Fera Science Limited – privatised agency who diagnose the PHSI's samples
GB	Great Britain
GSI	Growing Season Inspection – Physical inspections during active growth
GQI	General Quarantine Inspection – Physical inspections of intra-trade community material
НМІ	 Horticultural Marketing Inspectorate - inspectorate of the Rural Payments Agency (RPA) with responsibility for the enforcement of the EU Marketing Standards for fresh fruit and vegetables

HMRC	HM Revenue & Customs - the UK's tax, payments and customs authority
но	Harmful Organism
HONS	Hardy Ornamental Nursery Stock – fruit stock, roses, ornamental trees, shrubs, conifers, hedging plants
HSVd	Hop Stunt Viroid – the cause of hop stunt in Humulus lupulus
IP	Import Permit – Additional requirements stated by importing authorities of actions that need to be taken prior to export; it should accompany the Phytosanitary Certificate and the consignment
IPPC	International Plant Protection Convention – Agreement on plant health to prevent the introduction and spread of pests
LFD	Lateral Flow Device – used to detect the presence/absence of a specific analyte
MS	Member State – Countries belonging to the EU
NIAB	National Institute of Agricultural Botany – Provide research and information to the horticultural and agricultural industries
NPPO	National Plant Protection Organisation
ONS	Ornamental Nursery Stock – (See HONS)
P&D	Pest and Disease
PBR	Plant Breeder's Rights – A breeder's exclusive control and legal protection over plant material and new varieties
PC	Phytosanitary Certificate
PCN	Potato Cyst Nematodes (Globodera pallida/rostochiensis) – found in the soil and attack solanaceous plants
PEACH	Procedure for Electronic Application for Certificates from the HMI
РНА	Port Health Authorities – entrusted with preventing the introduction into the country of dangerous epidemic, contagious and infectious diseases and

	ensuring the wholesomeness of imported foodPHIT – Plant Health Import Task - work represented by a single entry (PEACH application) on the eDomero status screen
PHEATS	Plant Health Exports Audited Trader Scheme
POE	Point of Entry - Approved places where import consignments are located when it completes HMRC clearance procedures.
PP	Plant Passport – controls the movement of high risk material within the EU, following the creation of the European single market
PRA	Pest Risk Analysis – the process of evaluating a range of evidence to determine whether a pest should be regulated and the strength of any measures to be taken against it
PRS	Pesticide Residue Sampling – sampling of ware potatoes by PHSI as part of the UK's official monitoring programme, run by the Health & Safety Executive (HSE)
PSTVd	Potato Spindle Tuber Viroid – affects tomatoes, potatoes and solanaceous ornamentals; considered absent from the EU
PVS	Plant Varieties and Seeds – A section of the Inspectorate focusing on the regulation of plant breeders, the National Listing of varieties and seed certification
PWD	 Potato Wart Disease – caused by the soil-borne fungus Synchytrium endobioticum. Land is scheduled under Notice if intercepted and immune varieties have been developed
QS	Quarantine Surveillance
QPD	Quarantine Pest & Disease – Pests and diseases as listed in the PHO that must be notified to DEFRA upon interception
SID	Sample ID – Refers to samples created on eDomero
SLA	Service Level Agreement – Part of a contract where aspects of the commitment are quantified
SOP	Standard Operating Procedure – Documented ways of working to ensure a standard approach

RPA	Rural Payments Agency – the paying agency for the EU's Common Agricultural Policy (CAP) schemes in England (amongst other roles)
RR	Ring Rot – A quarantine disease of potato notifiable in the UK, caused by the bacterium <i>Clavibacter michiganensis.</i>
SOD	Sudden Oak Death – Caused by the fungus <i>Phytophthora ramorum,</i> which now affects a range of hosts.
SPCS	Seed Potato Classification Scheme – statutory scheme to ensure seed potatoes meet set standards set by the EC Directive. Certification grades cover SE, E, A.
TARIC	TARif Intégré Communautaire (Integrated Tariff of the European Communities) – shows the various rules applying to specific products imported into the EU
UK	United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland
UKBF	UK Border Force – A law enforcement command within the Home Office. Responsible for securing the UK border by carrying out immigration and customs controls for people and goods entering the UK
ωτο	World Trade Organisation
ZP	Zona Protecta (Protected Zone PZ) – Areas of the EU that are free from certain QPD that are established elsewhere in the EU; requires an authorised level of PP to allow the movement of host material into these zones
