#### EU Exit no deal, what you need to know

Importing and exporting plants and plant products if the UK leaves the EU without a deal

- <u>Guidance on importing and exporting plants and plant</u> products under a no deal can be found on Gov.uk.
- <u>stakeholder packs and scenario documents</u> are available on plant health portal.

Importing plants, fruit, vegetables or plant material to the UK Under a no deal the EU will treat the UK as a 3rd country, therefore the <u>guidance on importing to the UK from a 3rd country</u> will now apply to the UK when exporting to the EU in a no deal. # Consultation outcome – Pepino mosaic virus

Further to the Defra <u>consultation on the Pepino mosaic virus</u> from 12 Nov 2018 to 5th January 2019, on the future regulation of Pepino mosaic virus and receipt of responses, statutory action against Pepino mosaic virus will only be taken against findings in tomato seeds. More information can be found on the <u>UK Plant</u> <u>Health Risk Register</u>.

#### **New Pest Factsheets**

- <u>Pests of tomato crops and seed</u> the focus is primarily on viruses and viroids, but does include bacteria and nematodes.
- <u>Cotton stringy scale (Takahashia japonica)</u> plant pest factsheet has been added to the plant health portal. The scale insect feeds on a wide range of deciduous trees and was found in Italy in 2017 for the first time.

- <u>Tomato mottle mosaic virus</u>
